

Using Closed Captioning

 To start using CC, click the caption button




- Seleccionen "Spanish"

Using Rewordify.com to Make Written Materials **User-Friendly**



Reading Level of US Adults

National Assessment of Adult Literacy
(NAAL) published by the National Center for Education Statistics states that 50% of American adults are unable to read a book written at an 8th-grade level



What is readability?

Readability is the ease with which text can be read and understood









Applications or Programs with Readability

Considerations



Microsoft Word


• Microsoft Word bases readability on the Flesch Reading Ease and Flesch-Kincaid Grade Level tests that indicate how difficult a passage is to understand. The higher the score, the more difficult the text is to read.

To find your readability scores:

• Review>Spelling & Grammar

Troubleshooting:

- · Make sure the "show readability" box is checked
- Correct or Ignore all errors found in the document before the readability statistics will display





Hemingway Editor online https://hemingway-editor.en.softonic.com/application http://www.hemingwayapp.com/

The app highlights lengthy, complex sentences and common errors; if you see a yellow sentence, shorten or split it. If you see a red highlight, your sentence is so dense and complicated that your readers will get lost trying to follow its meandering, splitting logic — try editing this sentence to remove the red.

You can utilize a shorter word in place of a purple one. Mouse over them for hints.

Adverbs and weakening phrases are helpfully shown in blue. Get rid of them and pick words with force, perhaps.

Phrases in green have been marked to show passive voice.

You can **format** your *text* with the toolbar.

Paste in something you're working on and edit away. Or, click the Write button and compose something new.

Tips:


- ▶ Click the highlighted words to learn them and hear them. Click the non-highlighted words, too.
- ► Change how you learn on the settings page. Also, you can print vocab lists, quizzes, and more.
- ▶ When you log in, everything you rewordify is auto-saved and can be easily shared.



Using Headings


- Using headings helps screen reader users to understand how content is organized.
- Makes document navigation easier.
 People can jump from heading to heading.

Using Built in Formatting Tools





- Avoid inserting your own dashes when listing things
- Use the column tool to create columns
- Avoid using textboxes to format documents



Adding Alt Text to Images

Good Color Contrast

- Use WebAIM's "Color Contrast Checker"
- Let's use the RAISE Colors for an example
- WCAG 2.0 level AA requires a contrast ratio of at least 4.5:1 for normal text and 3:1 for large text.

Using Descriptive Hyperlinks

- Avoid phrases like:
 - Click here!
 - More
 - Click for details.
- Examples
 - Challenging: <u>Click here</u> for more information about the RAISE Center
