






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### **College Options for Students with Intellectual Disability, October 2023**



### This year...

- There are more than 420,000 school age students with intellectual disability in the United States<sup>1</sup>
- Fewer than 2% are likely to attend college after high school

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Students with ID attending college 2%

Students with ID who do not attend college 98%



## For the 98% of adults with intellectual disability who don't go to college - the current reality

- Only 15% have paid employment in the community<sup>2</sup>
- 42% attend a day program or sheltered workshop<sup>2</sup>
- 44% report they often or sometimes feel lonely<sup>2</sup>
- 29.3% live below the poverty line<sup>3</sup>

### For the 2% who attend postsecondary education, the outcomes are promising...

- 59% find competitive, integrated employment
  1 year after exit<sup>4</sup>
- 87% of students were enrolled in a credential program<sup>4\*</sup>
- 100% of programs provided peer mentor support to students<sup>4\*</sup>
