Title "A Self-Advocate's Guide to Vocational Rehabilitation (VR)"

Section 1

What is Vocational Rehabilitation (VR)?

Vocational Rehabilitation helps students with disabilities to find a job and with selfadvocacy. VR can be part of the student's IEP (Individualized Educational Plan) in school starting at age 14 until they graduate. VR can help with transition after high school and with independent living. Who Can use VR?

Anyone with a physical or mental disability can apply. Note: Some states have another VR agency for people who are blind or visually impaired. Students are chosen if besides having a disability, VR will help them get or keep a job, and they will benefit from VR services.ⁱ


What Services Can You Get from VR?

VR will help with job choices, supports such as coaching, AT (assistive technology) if needed for the job. VR may also pay for "tuition, fees, books, and vocational assessments".ⁱⁱ VR will help with tests, transportation, counseling/guidance, personal care assistance, etc.ⁱⁱⁱ These services also include:



What are Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS)?

These services for students include:



Pre-ETS is allowed for all students with disabilities even if they haven't applied to VR.
